## Taking a Stand to Fight For Your Rights.... Because It's the Right Thing to

Protecting our patients' rights and serving our agency partners is our entire livelihood and why we exist at Hudson Regional LTC Pharmacy. Recently, we were put in a very bad situation by an insurance company, but **we never once wavered from our morals and values.** Here's what happened....

In the State of New York, it's against regulations for a pharmacist to give copies of prescriptions to anyone who isn't the patient or the doctor. This is a good law that we support and uphold. If we were to give copies of a patient's prescription, we would be guilty of professional misconduct and could lose our license.

**Insurance companies ask for prescription copies all the time and we tell them "no".** Last month, Hudson Regional LTC Pharmacy's CEO, Angelo Angerame, got a letter from an insurance company stating that they're going to take \$2,000 away from the pharmacy due to our team not sending them a copy of the patient's prescription.

**They are demanding us to break the law!**

And we won't do it. **We fight for our patients' rights because it's the right thing to do!**

**We will protect patients and abide by the law at the cost of profit.** Angelo has been in touch with the State Board of Pharmacy, state professional organizations, New York State Senators, and talking with every local government official to make sure change happens so the insurance companies stop abusing patients' rights.

Unfortunately, other pharmacies will send insurance companies these prescription copies since it's the path of least resistance but it's not the right thing to do. **Hudson Regional LTC Pharmacy protects patient confidentiality, the rights of the patient and complies with the law.**

# VACCINES SAVE LIVES

## A Letter From **Our CEO** *Vaccines Save Lives*

As the Delta variant begins to surge and cases are happening all across our nation, I truly want to take a moment to express that our team is here for those we serve, especially for our agency partners who serve the intellectual and developmentally disabled. **We must do everything we can to help your residents, our patients, be protected from the virus.**

We know that vaccines save lives. If your residents have not yet received the Covid booster shot, or if you are awaiting the flu vaccine, let me urge you to get in touch with our team. As talks of a 'twin-demic' circulate—a bad flu season and resurgence of Covid—we **must be vigilant to protect those most vulnerable!**



In Orange County, Covid cases are growing. Here are some numbers to show what has happened over the summer months:  
June 238 positive cases | 3 deaths  
July 681 positive cases | 3 deaths  
August 3,025 positive cases | 21 deaths  
That is almost 5 times as many new cases and 7 times as many deaths in just 60 days. Unfortunately, we are not heading in the right direction. However, people who are vaccinated and are getting the Delta variant aren't getting as sick. It's good to see we are not having the correlating amount of deaths to cases because people have received the vaccination.

Don't forget, **our team is always here to serve you.** We care about your administration team, your staff of nurses, direct support professionals and your entire team who works tirelessly to serve the IDD community. ## New Bill Could Allow New York Pharmacies to Administer More Vaccines


One thing Covid has proved is that **pharmacies are a great way to get vaccines to people.** With that being said, the state of New York is considering allowing pharmacies to administer more vaccines outside of the current six they can now give.

Senate Bill S4807A, which is awaiting delivery and a signature from the Governor, would authorize licensed pharmacists and certified nurse practitioners to provide immunizations that are recommended by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention to patients eighteen years or older. If passed, the following vaccines will be available at pharmacies in New York.

- Hepatitis A
- Hepatitis B
- Human papillomavirus (HPV)
- Measles
- Mumps
- Rubella
- Varicella
- COVID-19

**The ability for pharmacists to give out vaccines can have a tremendous impact on the population.** The pandemic has tremendously skewed regular and routine vaccines schedules for children and adults since people have stayed at home and avoided regular doctor visits unless sick.

Currently, any licensed pharmacists in the State of New York, certified by the New York State Department of Education to vaccinate, can provide influenza, pneumococcal, meningococcal, herpes zoster, and tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis (Td or Tdap) vaccines to persons 18 years of age and older. Certified pharmacists can also administer influenza vaccines to persons 2 years of age and older.



## What You Need to Know About Messenger RNA Vaccines

Messenger RNA vaccines—also called mRNA vaccines—are a new type of vaccine to protect against infectious diseases, and are one of the first Covid-19 vaccines authorized for use in the U.S.

**The Moderna COVID-19 vaccine is a new mRNA vaccine.** This vaccine requires people to receive two shots, 28 days apart. However, Moderna's vaccine is not interchangeable with other Covid vaccines so be sure to get the same product for your second shot.

### How do mRNA vaccines work?

mRNA is the blueprint for making proteins in our bodies, and **we can use it as an immune system alarm clock** because mRNA tells cells how to make specific protein molecules that could be harmful if they came from bacteria or viruses like the flu virus.

To trigger this response, many mRNA vaccines put only pieces (or oligonucleotides) of the deactivated germ into our bodies instead of putting whole germs in there; **these fragments** don't cause illness but do **wake up your immune system so you're ready when real invaders come around.** mRNAs help to create proteins that fight off infection by sending messages inside of cells directly. **That immune response**, which produces antibodies, is what **protects us from getting infected** if the real virus enters our bodies, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

### New mRNA vaccines on the horizon

Moderna will pioneer other messenger RNA (mRNA) vaccines and therapeutics based on the company's experience with its Covid-19 vaccine. The expansion of these other mRNA vaccines will be for the seasonal flu, HIV, and the Nipah virus. Another vaccine program Moderna is working on is for the respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) for older adults.

## Employment Crisis

### Direct Support Professionals Industry is Facing a Shortage Crisis

We talk about this often but services for the intellectual and developmentally disabled are severely underfunded. As an effect of this, across the nation, and in New York, **there is an industry shortage of Direct Support Professionals (DSPs).**

DSPs work directly with people who have intellectual and developmental disabilities to help them realize their full potential, and support them in becoming engaged in their community.

What makes a DSP different than a caregiver is that a **DSP works with people to help enable them to do everyday activities independently.** Thousands of New Yorkers with IDD rely on DSPs in their daily life. Some essential activities they help with include getting out of bed, getting dressed, going to the bathroom, finding a job, transporting to and from work....the list is endless.

While these jobs are essential, the turnover rate has reached an all-time high and the workforce has plateaued. **DSPs are friends, a lifeline, an encouraging voice, a listening ear, a cheerleader, and offer a seat at the table.**

Hudson Regional LTC Pharmacy supports all IDD nurses, DSPs, and staff members who care for the individuals we love and serve. We know this is a thankless job, **but please know that we appreciate you and your service to IDD community!**



## Unemployment in New York

The U.S. unemployment rate currently sits at 5.4%, which indicates significant improvement from April 2020 when it hit an almost historic high of 14.8%.

**New York currently has an employment rate of 7.6%**, which is the 4th highest in the country, according to WalletHub's reports from July 2021. The following are more findings from New York's unemployment report.

- **96.37%** Change in Unemployment (July 2021 vs July 2019)
  - 708,641 unemployed people in July 2021 vs 360,869 in July 2019;
  - 5th worst recovery in the U.S.
- **96.89%** Change in Unemployment (July 2021 vs January 2020)
  - 708,641 unemployed people in July 2021 vs 359,918 in January 2020;
  - 5th worst recovery in the U.S.
- **-48.60%** Change in Unemployment (July 2021 vs July 2020)
  - 708,641 unemployed people in July 2021 vs 1,378,613 in July 2020;
  - 15th best recovery in the U.S.

The New York workforce is on its way to recovery and **we know our great state will come back stronger.** There are grants, tax credits, and technical assistance programs for businesses impacted by the pandemic.
