Crystal Run Village Foundation

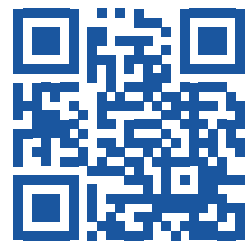
Date: Tuesday, September 29, 2026

New York's 2027 Budget

New York State's 2027 Fiscal Year budget is now enacted, and it includes real, meaningful investment in the people and programs so many of our partner agencies support every day. Here are a few highlights worth knowing about:

- OPWDD spending grows to over \$7.9 billion statewide, with nearly \$380 million in new resources this year alone.
- A 2.7% inflationary increase for voluntary operated providers, aimed at helping agencies manage rising costs and offer more competitive wages.
- A 5% rate increase for Family Care, one of OPWDD's most integrated residential options.
- \$30 million in new funding, growing to \$60 million annualized, to open new service opportunities for people entering the system or whose needs have changed.
- An additional \$15 million toward independent living housing development.
- A new \$5 million Assistive Technology Innovation Center to support research and startups building tools that help people with disabilities live independently.
- An enhanced Rent Freeze Program for seniors and people with disabilities, raising the income eligibility limit in New York City from \$50,000 to \$75,000, with similar options in Westchester, Nassau, and Suffolk counties.
- A new Adaptive Clothing Grant Program, backed by \$60,000 through the Fashion Innovation Center.

The budget also continues capital investment in the Institute for Basic Research in Developmental Disabilities on Staten Island and in Regional Disability Clinics expanding access to care.
